# What is an altered book?

An **altered book** is a form of mixed media artwork that changes a book from its original form into something else.

# Why altered books?

Altered books give new life, artistic purpose and meaning to used, old or abandoned books. People traditionally think of books as works of literary art — through altered book projects, books transform into works of visual art as well.

When will this take place? April 11—April 30, 2016: We will showcase local artist interpretations of altered books in special galleries (details inside).

# How do I participate?

First start with a book! We have plenty to get you started. Pick up free books, while supplies last, from your local MRL branch. Read the gallery guidelines inside, complete, sign and return the entry form with your art by 12 noon on Monday or Tuesday, April 4 or 5, 2016. (Please check that your MRL branch will be open on April 4 and/or April 5.)

## What is an Altered Book?

According to the International Society of Altered Book Artists an altered book "... is any book, old or new that has been recycled by creative means into a work of art. They can be ...rebound, painted, cut, burned, folded, added to, collaged in, gold-leafed, rubber stamped, drilled or otherwise adorned ... and yes! It is legal!"
